THIS WEEK'S LESSON: SPOT THE DIFFERENCE



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: Naaman sought out Elisha to heal him of his leprosy – a disease that left his skin spotted and gross. When Naaman followed Elisha's instruction, he was healed. But when Elisha's servant, Gehazi, acted selfishly, he was stricken with the same leprosy that Naaman was healed from. 2 Kings 5, Naaman



THANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Encourage all of your family members to look for ways to give and help one another this week, including yourself. As a family, look for a way to be humble and serve people outside your family as well.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What humbling thing did Naaman do to be healed?
- How did God humble Gehazi?
- Why is it important to be humble and not selfish?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Lord, you are great. You are really worthy of praise. No one can completely understand how great you are." Psalm 145:3 (NIrV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know: Being humble flies in the face of our modern, me-first culture but sets us apart as believers. Ask God to help you lead by example and teach your children and even your friends and co-workers to be humble.
